## Hill Maintenance

We will be kicking off this season with new ropes on both lifts. The current ropes have provided us with very good service of ~ 9 years for the small lift and 6 years for the main lift. Similar to last year there were no major equipment failures only a best effort "splice" late in the season on the small tow rope. The ropes are one of our biggest expenses. Please treat them with care.

Very little tow maintenance was conducted over the summer months. During our work party we will be inspecting and conducting some preventative maintenance to make certain all is ready for the first snowfall.


There were several electrical upgrades made in the A-frame providing more outlets for the hot chocolate maker. Also a total out house makeover was conducted consisting of a fresh coat of paint, working lights, vintage ski accents, and an outlet in the women's area for a small heater.

In the next several years there will be a focus on upgrading the main lift tow building and tensioning system. We expect to be decoupling the building from the lift pole and placing both the structure and the main lift pole on concrete pillars. Additionally, the building will be set back from its current location to allow for ease of egress at the top of the lift. Critical steps of this project are expected to be conducted in the summer of 2011. Check the web site in the future for more details.

# Groomer / Machinery Report

Snow grooming definition – The process of manipulating snow for recreational uses, usually using a snow groomer vehicle

The groomer logged around 300 miles last season adjusting the snow to near ideal conditions. With very little snow and a closely mowed hill, (thanks Scott and Don) we can pack and move snow around so members can be enjoying the hill even if there is grass showing in the fields just miles away.

As always, grooming is conducted later in the week during the evening hours. If you happen to be skiing when the groomer is out, please maintain a safe distance of 50 feet from the groomer.

This year we added a DR Brush mower to the fleet of tools to help us prepare for the skiing season. This machine will be specifically helpful in the areas that are not accessible with large tractors.

# Lean- to out post

In the effort to provide a location at the top of the main hill where folks can gather, view the whole ski slope, and get out of the weather, in the summer of 2011 we will be constructing an Adirondack Lean To similar to the one pictured. This structure will be a great place to watch the skiers on the hill, or spend an overnight, winter or summer.

Although you cannot see the Lean To on the SkiVenture landscape today, you may have seen logs scattered around the property. The logs for this structure were harvested (with permission) from our neighbor's property over the last several months.


